HAPPY THANKSGIVING....ALMOST!



HISTORY OF THANKSGIVING

How did this "All American" tradition really begin? Over 300 years ago travel-worn pilgrims of the Mayflower arrived in the New World during the year of 1620. After a very long and treacherous journey, the young band of travelers hunkered down for the winter. That winter many would die from disease and exposure. However, luck seemed to be on their side as spring started and the Pawtuxet tribe came to their rescue. The tribe taught them how to survive in the New World. To celebrate a successful harvest, pilgrim and Indian alike came together to partake of the first Thanksgiving feast. However, at this feast there wasn't a football game, parade, or decadent pies and desserts. In fact, not until 1789 was Thanksgiving an official national holiday.
