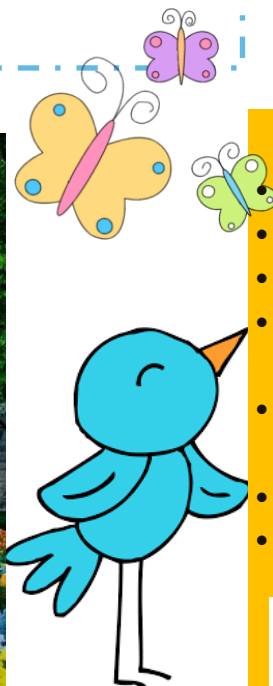

**Richie Call** is an Assistant Professor in the BFA Acting Program at Utah State University's Caine College of the Arts. He is also an online instructor at Rutgers University Mason Gross School of the Arts, where he received his MFA in acting. In addition to Richie's teaching positions, he is also Co-Artistic Director of the Lyric Repertory Company where he has performed and directed for 16 seasons. Other professional acting credits include: Utah Shakespeare Festival, Pioneer Theatre Company, Salt Lake Acting Company, Salt Lake Shakespeare, Mile Square Theatre, American Globe Theatre, and Gorilla Rep. Richie also has film credits with CBS Daytime, Walt Disney Pictures, and LDS Motion Picture Studios. Richie is a proud member of the Actors' Equity Association. **Richie will teach 1 class this summer: Acting: Scene Study (July 9 - July 25).**

**Star Coulbrooke**, Poet Laureate of Logan City, Utah, and Utah State University Writing Center Director, is the co-founder and coordinator of Helicon West, a bi-monthly open readings/featured readers series. Published widely in lit mags and anthologies, Star's poems are also available in chapbooks, notably *Walking the Bear*, which can be accessed through the Digital Stacks at the University of Utah Marriott Library. Star's poems are internationally published in literary journals, magazines, and anthologies. As poet laureate, Star conducts monthly poetry walkabouts and poetry workshops, from which she composes collaborative community poems using lines contributed by those who attend her events. Star also composes poems for various events and public figures, one of which was her poem for the inauguration of USU president Noelle Cockett in May of 2015. Her most recent poetry collection is *Thin Spines of Memory*.

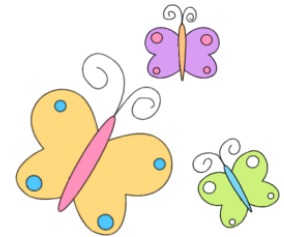

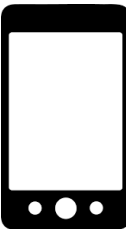

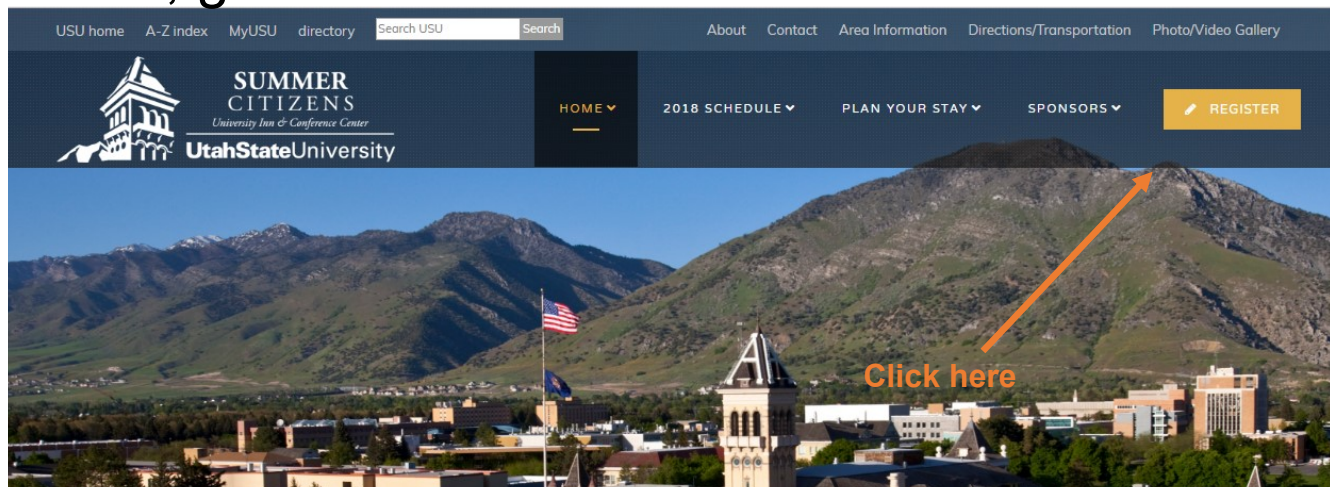
